

Session 1: Communion

Key Scriptures: Luke 24:17-27

Opening:

Communion requires communication. As the hands, feet, and mouth of Jesus Christ, we must learn that listening is just as powerful as talking.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Our mission is to walk with people toward Jesus. Our mission is to live and share the Word of God by walking with them in communion. Where do we begin? How can we fulfill that mission?
- 2. When we are in communion with people from all manners of life, communication can be challenging. How do we navigate challenging conversations?
- 3. In the communion phase of our mission, we must testify about the promises He has given us. What can you share that will help communicate the love of God? What mission has He given to us?

Closing Remarks:

We have an obvious mandate to reach our world. Let's take a moment to pray for God to give us wisdom as we commune with those we walk with.

NOTES:

Session 2: Revelation

Key Scriptures:

Luke 24:28-31

Opening:

Communion is a long, patient walk. We are called to love people where they are. Loving leads to revelation.

Discussion Questions:

- Revelation comes through demonstration.
 What can we do to demonstrate the love of God through us?
- 2. As we walk our missional path, we must reveal Christ by the things we do as much or more than the things we say. In what way can we reveal Jesus through our actions?
- 3. Let's talk about the broken bread. Jesus wasn't just eating with friends. He was showing Himself lowly. How can humility help our influence? What sacrifice can we make to help reveal the Jesus who lives inside us?

Closing Remarks:

When communion gives way to revelation, we must learn to step back and let God move others into a deep walk with Him. This is when we initiate the prayer found in John 17:6-7. This gives those we walk with the space needed to find His grace. Let's pray for the ones we walk with.

NOTES:

Session 3: Commission

Key Scriptures: Luke 24:33-48

Opening:

Communion and revelation lead to action. We must use every opportunity to encourage the people we are walking with by sharing who Jesus is.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Most Christians share their story at the beginning of their journey, rather than at the end. In what ways can we encourage them to share this revelation with others? How do we lead them as they lead others?
- 2. The revelation of who Jesus is holds great value in the plan of salvation. Let's discuss the journey of salvation as instructed in Acts 2:38.
- 3. The great commission is much more than fulfilling the plan of salvation—it requires being a conduit for others. How can we encourage them to make disciples?

Closing Remarks:

As with any new believer, challenges will arise and one of the areas that the enemy attacks is their confidence. Let's take a moment to pray that God will remove any fear and fuel their faith so they can be a greater witness to those they share Jesus with.

Session 4: Impartation

Luke 24:49-53

Opening:

Our commission cannot be fulfilled by ourselves. We need the help of God—an impartation of His Spirit that leads us as we lead others.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Until we are filled with His Spirit, we are powerless to walk in God's will. The path we walk isn't just a way to Heaven; it's a missional path on earth. How do we ready ourselves for this journey? How do prepare those we walk with for impartation?
- 2. It is important to know that travelers will experience moments of weariness and require rest. In Matthew 11:28-29, Jesus invites us to find rest in Him. What can we do to embrace moments of rest and how do we refrain from being weary in well doing?
- 3. Impartation saves us and it equips us. Let's discuss the benefits of walking together in the Spirit.

Closing Remarks:

As we conclude this series, let's take a few moments to pray that God will direct our lives as we journey in communion, revelation, commission, and impartation.
